As we were traveling to and from North Carolina over the Christmas holiday, we were riveted to the radio reports of the tsunami disaster in Indonesia, Sri Lanka, India, Sumatra, and other neighboring countries. It continues to be mind-boggling when I try to conceptualize the magnitude of this tragedy, not just with the loss of life, but with the inability to get needed supplies to those who survived and are now isolated. No matter what faith we profess, I believe we all have turned to our God in prayer and in supplication for answers or at least directions in what we can do. I encourage each of you who reads this to contribute to some relief agency which seeks to be of service to the manifest needs of so many, many people.

One of the stories which came out of this tragedy (which reveals that even in the worst of circumstances, good can emerge) has to do with the decades long civil war going on in Sri Lanka. It seems that both sides are finding common ground in trying to deal with a national disaster which transcends politics or economics. Maybe out of this both sides will find a way to dwell together in unity.

In September of 1917, at the first convention of the National Exchange Club, Charles Berkey, who went on to become the first president of our national organization, came up with the motto for the Exchange Club: "Unity for Service." Berkey said the inspiration for the motto came from Psalm 133 where it is written: "*Behold how good and pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity*." It simply means the Golden Rule in three words – do unto others as you would have them do unto you.

Wherever there is a need, I see and hear of how Exchangites have stepped forward to make a difference. There is indeed a unity in our service to others, and I pray in this new year that we continue to unite around those causes and events which enable us to make a difference – doing for others what we certainly would want done for us if and when circumstances changed in our lives.

So as we each step boldly into this new year of 2005, I encourage you to keep your faith in your God, keep your faith in yourselves, and keep the faith in Exchange!

HEALING FIELD SET FOR APRIL 1

Did you know that 1,669 cases of child abuse were reported in Ft. Bend County last year?

During April 2005, Child Abuse Prevention Month, The **Exchange Club of Sugar** Land will create a Child Abuse Healing Field of over 1,500 flags. The flags will represent reported cases of child abuse in Ft Bend County in 2004.

The Light of Hope community candle lighting event presented by **Friends of Child Advocates of Fort Bend County** and **The Exchange Club of Sugar Land** will take place on Friday, April 1, 2005. The festivities will begin at 5:30 p.m. in front of City Hall in our new Sugar Land Town Center.

Some flags will be posted that evening in the field between Methodist Hospital and the First Colony Mall. The remaining flags will be posted on Saturday beginning with a ceremony at 10:00 a.m. Individuals can purchase the 3'x5' flags for \$25. each. The Healing Field will remain standing for one week. Flags purchased **must** be picked up on Sunday, April 10th between 12:00-5:00. Unclaimed flags will be donated to BSA.

Chairman **Michael Cole**, and Vice-chairs **Norma Reyna** and **David Lanagan** are excited about the prospect of donating the funds from the sale of the flags to various child abuse prevention agencies.
