Mayor Thompson gave Exchangites and update on Sugar Lands plan to renovate the Imperial Sugar Plant area. The redevelopment project will preserve the history of the Sugar Mill, while adding residential and business developments and green space among the historical buildings. He commented on the proposed minor league baseball stadium/entertainment complex with future plans for hotels and businesses. He also spoke of negotiations in progress to try to get a team affiliated with the Atlantic League to play at the stadium. They are hoping for a 140 game season with 72 home games.
