**Larry Pullen** was the veteran selected to speak of his experiences during the Vietnam War. His first operational assignment was as a C-124 ("Old Shakey") transport pilot, flying to Southeast Asia for the first time in 1961. Nobody ever said it was a beautiful airplane, but it was a huge machine for its time. The worldwide mission in Military Air Transport Service had Larry engaged in evacuating United Nations troops from the former Belgian Congo, taking U.S. troops to the Dominican Republic during that conflict, flying in Antarctica for three months, and negotiating the three Berlin corridors in the Cold War. The 3,800 flying hours he logged in the Air Force enabled him to join Delta Air Lines and work for that company for 30 years. He is now a professional photographer and has produced wonderful photos for The Sugar Land Exchange Club for many years.
