President Steve Griffith Wants Your Opinion...



Thanks to all for the unbelievable effort in keeping our club organized and involved.

It is more than a little overwhelming for me... trying to keep up with all of the service opportunities and all of the club activities. It is ONLY possible because members of this club are so willing to take ownership and just "make things happen". There have been so many times that I am told that all the details of a club activity or service opportunity have been handled.....all I

need to do is help coordinate the announcements or just plain old, "show up". I have to admit, I have never fully appreciated the dedication of the members of our club, until now. I am constantly in awe of everyone's willingness to take ownership and make things happen. We are so much like a large family. We all take care of one other and we all take care of what we need to do.

I wanted to ask for the Club's input about a couple of issues we will be discussing at the Board meetings over the next couple of months. At the September board meeting, we plan to discuss some ideas that Patrick La Rue and his committee have presented about membership. The Membership committee has been working to set up monthly Membership/Guest Socials. On the third Thursday of each month, we are inviting, not only new members, but all of the guests from the previous month. Patrick is building on this concept and will be asking members to bring a guest to this social. Patrick has asked that we consider membership opportunities for people, who are interested in service, but may not be able to attend weekly meetings. National has several "categories" of membership." So, the structure appears to be there for this, but is this something we want to pursue?

Second, at the October board meeting we plan to discuss our **Club's commitment to Child Abuse Prevention**. In the past, we have largely supported (in financial terms) the ESCAPE Family Resource Center www.learntoparent.org. This last year, we moved that support to Fort Bend charitable efforts related to Child Abuse. We also gave seed money to an "Escape Like" effort run by the DePelchin Children's Center www.depelchin.org and the Fort Bend Regional Council on Substance Abuse www.fortbendcouncil.org. This year's budget continues the transformation we started last year. Ruthanne Mefford has suggested that our club make an additional commitment to Child Advocates of Fort Bend www.cafb.org through alliance/ ambassadorship opportunities by Exchangites to work directly on this issue of child abuse, as well as financial support. I believe her suggestion leads to questions that we have not asked/answered. What does this club want to accomplish in our **primary effort - Child Abuse?** Should we be working to establish a Fort Bend "Escape Like" function in Fort Bend, or should we look to an existing resource? Talk to any member of the board about the above issues. I don't know that any of the board members have preconceived ideas....we are all open to member's input and suggestions. Just like any family, I don't think we should be afraid of taking on "tough" questions; we want to do what is in the best interest of our family and our community. Steve Griffith, President
