"Trails to Texas Independence: 1528 A.D. to 1848 A.D." is a joint project of the Texas, Louisiana Gulf Coast Exchange Clubs and the San Jacinto Museum of History, located at the San Jacinto battleground. It is an exhibit of maps, flags, copies of historical documents, and transcriptions of letters of the time, coupled with a brief narrative that describes the development of Texas from its origin to the conclusion of the United States war with Mexico (1846-1848), when lands from Texas to the Pacific Ocean were ceded by Mexico to the United States. Documents such as the Texas Declaration of Independence of 1836, Travis' Letter of Appeal from the Alamo in February and The Treaty of Velasco, which granted Texas independence from Mexico, have all been reproduced with care from authentic sources and provide a flavor of the times. The Exchange Club of Sugar Land donated \$2000 to acquire the plagues for the display at Constellation Park. The Exchange Clubs of Fort Bend, Quail Valley & Houston also attended the dedication ceremony at Constellation Park on June 28, 2013.
