Bob Dunham has been delivering meals to seniors for **Fort Bend Seniors Meals on Wheels** for many years. He is also a Deacon at St. Laurence Church. He told members that he enjoys talking with the elderly to whom he delivers hot meals. <u>www.fortbendseniors.org</u>

Jim Lockwood is on the board of **Child Advocates of Fort Bend.** Their mission is to **provide a voice** for abused and neglected children by providing them with a CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate and Guardian Ad litem) who advocates for their best interests in family court. They also **heal the hurt** through free individual and family counseling. Child Advocates partners with the District Attorney and Law Enforcement Agencies to **stop the abuse** by making sure the perpetrator is brought to justice. <u>www.cafb.org</u>
