Our Speaker for this past Wednesday was Constable Trever Nehls! He delivered a great talk, updating us on how the Constable's office works, what they do and who they serve. Thank you, Constable, you were FIT-tastic!

LAW ENFORCEMENT ACHIEVEMENTS

- Trever began his career in law enforcement in 1991 with the Fox Lake, Wisconsin Police Department.
- Two years later he moved to the State of Texas seeking more opportunities in law enforcement. He was hired by Sugar Land Police Department (SLPD) in November of 1993.
- Served in numerous capacities with SLPD retiring at the rank of Sergeant in 2011 as a result of winning Constable election.
- Currently serves as Fort Bend County Precinct 4 Constable.

MILITARY HONORS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

• Trever enlisted into the Wisconsin Army National Guard in 1988 and attended basic training at Fort Benning, Georgia.

• He graduated the Wisconsin Military Academy Officer Candidate School in July 1991, commissioned as a Second Lieutenant.

• In 1993, Trever moved to Texas to continue his law enforcement career. He transferred his military service to the Texas National Guard.



• In 2000, Trever transferred his military service and joined a Civil Affairs Battalion in the United States Army Reserve. In 2004, Trever deployed to Iraq with the 451st Civil Affairs Battalion, Pasadena, Texas.

• Trever remained a member of the 451st Civil Affairs Battalion for over 5 years. He was assigned as the Executive Officer responsible for the deployment of the Battalion to Afghanistan in 2008. During this second overseas combat tour, he served as an Executive Officer of a Provincial Reconstruction Team, in Zabul Province, Afghanistan. Upon his return to Fort Bend County, Trever was notified

that he was selected to attend the resident Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. Only the best, most qualified Reserve Officers are selected to attend this prestigious military college.

• Upon graduation from the Command and General Staff College in 2009, Trever was assigned to return to Afghanistan. While serving in Afghanistan, Trever was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. In Afghanistan, Trever served as a military liaison with an Afghan National Army Colonel, 4th Kandak, 2nd Corp, Afghanistan National Army. He returned from Afghanistan in July, 2011.

• Upon return from his third combat tour, Trever held command of the 415th Civil Affairs Battalion in Kalamazoo, MI. Currently, he serves as Battalion Commander of the 490th Civil Affairs Battalion in Grand Prairie, Texas.

• Trever is a July 2015 graduate of the United States Army War College, Carlisle Barracks, PA.
