Yet many millions have not responded to the recall. The cars affected will have both the driver and passenger side airbags replaced free of charge. Protec yourself and your loved ones by taking 30 second s to check if your car is affected.

Simply visit airbagrecall.com to upload a photo of your license plate or enter your vehicle identification number (VIN) to determine if your car has a defective airbag inflator. Call your automakers nearest dealership.

If your car is affected, the airbag inflator will be replaced for free.
