

To reach one child, one family, one community by creating awareness and providing support to families living with autism spectrum disorder. To bring about positive social change and create an inclusive community where each child's unique abilities are acknowledged and fostered.



Hope For Three was inspired by the plight of an amazing mother and father in Fort Bend County who experienced the triple pleasure and heartbreak of having identical triplets all diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).

Helplessly watching this family navigate the frustrating waters of maxed out social services, excessive bureaucracy,

denials by insurance companies and indifference by society, close friends pondered their options and as a result, Hope For Three was created in April 2011.

Inspired by the Montgomery triplets, Hope For Three, a local nonprofit and autism advocacy group, was established to raise community awareness and provide resources and support, in the form of financial aid, to families with children diagnosed with ASD.
