Exchange Club of Sugar Land invites you to give along with us to the organizations that we support. Presentations of checks for this week were sent to the Fort Bend Rainbow Room for \$2,000 and Crimestoppers for \$5,000.



<u>The Rainbow Room</u> is a resource room stocked with snacks, diapers, school supplies, clothes, toiletries, toys and other items frequently needed to meet the emergency needs of families in crisis. Our philosophy is that abused and neglected children and adults do not deserve used items, so only new items are stocked. Getting new items can have a significant impact on the children in helping them feel cared for and fit in with their peers at school. The Room is available to caseworkers 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for any of our clients.

<u>Crime Stoppers</u> is a program that empowers regular people to fight back against crime. Anyone can submit an anonymous tip by using our Online Web Tips, Mobile Tips, or by calling the Tip Line. If that tip leads to an arrest, you can receive a cash reward! Congratulations to these organizations and continue your good work! (Note: Photos altered from presentations last year)



If you have not yet heard of **Crime Stoppers** in Sugar Land TX, then we invite you to explore our non-profit organization and learn about the exciting, effective ways in which we're promoting safety and security throughout the local community.

One common misconception is that Sugar Land Crime Stoppers is a law enforcement agency. This is untrue. We are an independent organization that has developed a variety of resources that provide community members with everything they need to recognize crime issues in the community and take steps to solve them.

However, Crime Stoppers does work closely in a partnership with law enforcement, especially when it comes to collecting information.






Nora Sims...
