His vast experience has taught him a great deal about how to lead, operate, and serve on a nonprofit in ways that will maximize revenues and enhance the positive community impact.

In Jon's presentation to us he said **UNC TV Public Media** organization said that we make up to 35,000 decisions a day. And In his topic to us he was telling us how as leaders we can make **GREAT** decisions. And how our decisions as leaders impacts the lives of others in the organization. Mentioning a book "Decisive" written by Chip and Dan Heath, Jon identified for us the 4 villains of decision making. 1) Narrow framing. 2)Confirmation bias. 3) Short term emotion. 4) Over confidence.

In Jon's presentation, as his time to speak was limited, he went over **6 Practices** to "**Gather What You Need**" to make GREAT decisions as leaders 1) Gather yourself in the moment. 2) Make it a daily habit. 3)Set aside time each season & retreat. 4)Bring in other people. 5) List out tons of ideas. 6) Get the information you can. Jon had a wonderful personality. Very informative and entertaining.
