It was a busy final day of the 2020-2021 Exchange year. We started the day by dedicating a new Freedom Shrine at the Fort Bend Central Appraisal District. Thanks **Nick Landoski** for setting this up and **Jim Kij** for not only conducting the ceremony but also installing the whole thirty plaques! That evening we were able to successfully swear in the 2021-2022 Board, Officers, and President. Congratulations to our new President **Rick Bell**!

We had a fantastic year due to our great members! We won't let a little pandemic stop the ECSL from continuing our good work. At our Installation Dinner I talked about some of the "Firsts" we had this past Exchange year and some interesting statistics. We held he first Exchange Club of Sugar Land Installation Breakfast on June 24, 2021

It was also the first Installation done virtually.

The first Drive Through Santa's Exchange was December 19, 2020 in a howling monsoon.

First time we were frozen out of a meeting was on February 17, 2021 in the Great Ice Storm of 2021. No one had power to get on Zoom.

October 24, 2020 we had the Spaghetti Dinner. Six months later to get back on schedule, April 17, 2021 we had the second Spaghetti Dinner of the Exchange year, the first time we had two Spaghetti Dinners in the same year and first time we had virtual Spaghetti Dinners. In both cases we raised over \$100,000. ContinuedEvery time we present a check, honor a youth, work at a food drive, or do anything as a club it is recorded with the National Exchange Club as a "Project of Service". They like to know what all the clubs are doing. This year we recorded 100 projects. 100! That's almost two a week. Here's what our group was able to accomplish and the stats.

- 12 Americanism projects.
- 9 Child Abuse Prevention projects.
- 44 Youth Programs.
- 26 Community Service projects.
- 9 Fundraisers totaling over \$227,000 raised.
- Funding to 30 different charitable groups totaling \$103,454.
- 46 Zoom meetings and 2 in person meetings.
- 6 really fun socials. A Skeeters game, a Night at the Movies (Jurassic Park), a Picnic/War games with Sugar Land Rotary, we won! Dinner & Drinks at Willies Ice House, and two "take Jack and May Williams to lunch". That's as many Socials as we have in a normal year.
- Your Board of Directors met for 12 regular meetings and 4 special meetings all via Zoom.
- Sadly, we lost two very active members. Charlie Braun and Ed Lee.

Thank you Exchange members for making 2020-2021 the great year that it was. It was an honor and a blast serving as your President. #ClearedForTakeoff.

We live in a society that is constantly changing. More and more active violence scenarios are developing, and there is not enough training in schools, departments, or city businesses that can prepare for this misfortunate event. The goal is to have every department and outside agency be on the same page if a tragedy were to occur. The correct application of tourniquets or accurately packing a wound can be vital for a patient's survival. This education program we started is meant to build more confidence in all attendees as they will be well equipped for any trauma scenario.

**The Active Violence Program** for the Sugar Land Fire Department has developed an agenda involving three phases. Each phase of the training gets bigger as it leads into the live scale scenario we will host in <u>January 2022</u>. The list of attendees that have been involved have Sugar Land Fire, Sugar Land Police, Sugar Land Dispatch, City Hall Members, Missouri City Fire, Stafford Fire, Richmond Fire, Fort Bend County EMS, Community Volunteer Fire, Wilson County from San Antonio, Memorial Hermann Life Flight, and the Department of Homeland Security. It is so great to see everyone in one room working together to achieve the same goal.

Phase II is at the James Reese Career and Technical Centre. Volunteers are needed as follows:

### So, how did Carolyn Tarver start "Project Smile" many years ago!



Carolyn Tarver- **Project SMILE** stands for "**Stan's Memory Includes Loving Everyone**". (Stan was Carolyn's son who had died from and accident) We began by giving gifts to twelve children at a youth center in 1983. In 1995 the Exchange Club said that if I would call our Christmas outreach "Santa's Exchange" they would help me add 500 children that year and provide a place from which to distribute the gifts. They said that Santa's Exchange would be in support of Project SMILE. Christmas of 1994 we had 1200 children and in 1995, the first year of Santa's Exchange, we had 1800 children. For the following 18 years - before Toys for Tots - the Sugar Land Exchange Club, the Sugar Land Rotary Club, and the

Fort Bend Exchange Club joined together in support of Project SMILE at Christmas and made thousands and thousands of smiles through the years. Project SMILE is a beautiful tribute to my son Stan, as well as a great blessing to the many children whose smiling faces reflect their joy when they receive their gifts. I am very grateful for those years of Santa's Exchange support.
