Speaker Series

Our featured speaker for January 26th Exchange breakfast meeting was Executive Director **Ruthanne Mefford with Child Advocates of Fort Bend** standing with **Rick Bell**. She has been actively involved as an Exchange member for many years! She is very dedicated to her position as Executive Director with Child Advocates and Exchange Club by helping abused kids and families.

Ruthanne updated us on many of the ways Child Advocates assist children suffering from abuse. She also informed us that there has been a significant movement to incorporate trauma-based therapy. The hope of transitioning to trauma-based therapy is to not only reduce the instances of child abuse but to make an effort to eradicate the abuse in its entirety.

"Child Advocates of Fort Bend is a nonprofit agency serving child victims of sexual abuse, physical abuse and neglect through two nationallyaffiliated Advocacy Center (CAC). Started in 1991, it celebrated its 30th anniversary in 2021 having served nearly 19,000 children ages birth-18+ years old over these years. Its mission is to: Provide a Voice, Heal The Hurt and Break the Cycle of Abuse and Neglect for Children in Fort Bend County." (taken from their website cafb.org).



Speaker Series



Our guest speaker on January 19th was **Daniella Perez** who is the Prevention Program Manager at Love146.ORG which is a charitable 501(C) organization.

Founded in 2002, Love146's mission is to journey alongside children impacted by trafficking today and prevent the trafficking of children tomorrow. This goal is partly achieved through education. Love146 teaches both children and caretakers how to recognize signs and risk factors associated with trafficking.

The story of how they got their name, as told by CEO & Co-founder Rob Morris.

One night in the fall of 2002, I witnessed the horrific crime of people selling children in a brothel.

Some friends and I wanted to learn more about the issue of child trafficking and see how we could be helpful. We connected with an organization that was actively working to combat human trafficking. We visited one of their operating centers in Southeast Asia where investigators were going undercover into a brothel where they believed children were being exploited. They invited us to join them – which in retrospect, we've learned isn't a good idea and could potentially harm victims.

We found ourselves in a room looking through a glass wall where there were young girls wearing red dresses. Each girl had a number pinned to her dress — even the dignity of a name was stripped away. On my side of the glass wall, menus were handed out with prices for different sex acts that listed each girl by number. I struggled to comprehend the traumatic situation I was witnessing. The children sat motionless, watching cartoons on crackling TVs.

ONLY ONE GIRL WASN'T WATCHING THE CARTOONS. SHE WAS STARING AT US THROUGH THE GLASS WITH A PIERCING GAZE.



I'll never forget the look on her face: Was it fight? Or was it panic, the hypervigilance that so often follows trauma? Maybe it was disgust. In my heart, I hoped it was defiance.


We thought we were going to see *the issue* of human trafficking that night. Instead, we saw a *person*. That moment changed something in me. Ever since, it's challenged me to not look away.
