Speaker Series



On February 2nd, our "lined-up" speaker for our breakfast meeting canceled the night before at 10pm. Moral of this story you ask? When you need someone to save the day just call **Kevin Barker** with Texana Center to help and he'll be ready to make a full presentation to your audience. Kevin did save the meeting and if you are reading this "**Just Call Kevin**" (JCK) from now on! He can probably do anything to save your day! Standing here with Rick Bell President of Exchange Club of Sugar Land!

Kevin Barker oversees Behavior Support, Day Habilitation, Nursing, Residential, Supported Employment, and Vocational services for our six county region. Kevin joined Texana in 2005 and has over 25 years of experience in serving people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. He is a Licensed Professional Counselor and received his Bachelor of Arts and Master of Arts Degree in Psychology from Texas A&M University at Corpus Christi. Prior to joining Texana he was the manager of Home and Community-Based Services for MHMR of Nueces County.

Kevin presented a very informative presentation on the services provided by Texana. Texana Center is a 501(c)3 public, not for profit, organization that provides behavioral healthcare and developmental disabilities services to residents of a six county area that includes Austin, Colorado, Fort Bend, Matagorda, Waller and Wharton Counties.

The center began operations on September 1, 1999, following a merger of two other healthcare organizations. Texana Center has its headquarters in Rosenberg in Fort Bend County, which is one of the fastest growing counties in the nation. The center has an annual operating budget of \$55,000,000 and a staff of 855.

Texana serves over 16,000 annually in its array of service programs that are located in each of the six counties, covering about 6,000 square miles.

Mission statement -Texana Center's mission is to deliver life changing services to people with behavioral health issues and intellectual and developmental disabilities.


