

We learned how the organization utilizes sailing to provide relief, assistance, and opportunities to veterans and active military service members and their families through sail training, coastal cruising excursions, and offshore sailing expeditions. Recently, the program was also opened up for first responders and their families.

It is not a coincidence that Homer's "Odyssey" is about a warrior and his experiences returning from war. Post Traumatic Stress (PTS) has played an influential role in societies from the beginning of time. Odysseus, was a warrior and a sailor. He spent ten years fighting beneath the walls of Troy before setting a course westward. It took him another ten years battling the sea and his own demons to return home alive before he could resume his role as a father and a husband.

This is a scenario with which many service members, veterans, and their families can identify. Service, deployments, and for some, combat can test our endurance and resolve, and it is not unusual for someone who has served to find that life at home is less familiar than life in the military. In some instances, returning home and reintegrating with civilian society can be as challenging, or more so, than service, deployment, or combat.
