2018 Accomplishments Displays

- 22 different events

- Attendance estimates over 16,000 people
- New permanent display at Retzer Nature Center now open—estimated attendance since opening April 28 is 16,000.



Rain Gardens/Rain Barrels

- Provided 2 rain garden programs for 83 people
- ▶ 21 rain barrels sold in annual sale



Yard Waste Composting

- Hosted 1 home composting workshop for 57 people
- Sold 18 compost bins at annual sale
- Processed/Composted 3000 tons of waste from municipalities thru October.



Citizen Stream Monitoring

- Trained 19 new volunteers for Level 1
- Volunteers monitored 29 sites
- 6 additional sites monitored by County
- Phosphorus data collected at 1 site with state funding

Jericho Creek

 Annual appreciation event attended by 29 volunteers



School Teachers and Students

- Project WET training to 12 staff in Waukesha School District
- ▶ 2 Tour/Training opportunities for teachers with 34 attending
- 44 presentations to over 2154 students
- ► 10 field experiences to 879 students
- Provided 2 schools rain barrels and 2 different schools rain garden plants through green schools program
