10.24.010 Disorderly conduct with a motor vehicle.

A. Definition. Disorderly conduct with a motor vehicle constitutes engaging in violent, abusive, or unreasonably loud conduct, which disturbs the public peace or endangers the property or safety of another person. Deliberate, intentional, or unnecessary conduct including, but not limited to, engine compression braking, idling of engine for more than thirty (30) minutes, squealing of tires, revving of engine, blowing of horn, or causing the engine to backfire constitute disorderly conduct with a motor vehicle. B. No person shall, within the Village of Oakfield, by or through the use of any motor vehicle including, but not limited to, an automobile, truck, motorcycle, mini-bike, snowmobile, cause or provoke disorderly conduct, cause a disturbance, or annoy one or more persons, or disturb or endanger the property or the safety of another person.

C. No person operating a truck, tractor/trailer, or other motor vehicle within the village limits shall use a braking device activated or operated by the compression of the vehicle's engine, except in case of emergency. (Ord. 2004-9 and 2004-10)

10.24.020 Penalty for violation.

Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a penalty as provided in Chapter 1.20 of this code. (Ord. 2010-5)
