10.12.010 All-night parking.

No person shall park or leave standing any vehicle on any street in the village of Oakfield for a period of time longer than thirty (30) minutes, between the hours of two-thirty (2:30) a.m. and six (6:00) a.m., upon any day between the first day of December and the following first day of April, both dates inclusive, except physicians or emergency vehicles on emergency calls. (Ord. 2001-19)

10.12.020 Sunday parking.

No person, whether a tenant or otherwise, shall park or leave standing any vehicle between the hours of seven a.m. and twelve noon on Sundays upon the west side of South Second Street between Gilson Avenue and Waupun Street. (Prior code § 4.03[2])

10.12.030 No parking at any time.

No person shall park or leave standing any vehicle at any time:

1. On the west side of Main Street, between Filby Street and Waupun Street. (Prior code § 4.03[3])
2. On the west side of North Second Street between Hubbard Street and East Church Street. (2007-10)

10.12.040 Parking for the primary purpose of advertising.

No person shall park or leave standing on any street in the village of Oakfield any vehicle for the primary purpose of ad-

vertising. (Prior code § 4.03[4])

10.12.050 Parking semi-tractors, semitrailers, trucks, and buses

A. No person shall park any semi tractor, semitrailer, truck exceeding five tons, or school bus on the streets in the village of Oakfield at any time except for loading or unloading and such time shall not exceed one hour.

B. Any person who shall violate any provision of this section may be fined not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) per day nor more than twenty dollars (\$20.00) per day for the first offense, and not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per day nor more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) per day for the second or subsequent offense within a year. (Ord. dated 11/9/83)

10.12.060 Restrictions on parking; posted limitations.

Forty eight-hour limitation. No person shall park or leave standing any automobile, truck, tractor, trailer or vehicle of any description on any public street or public parking lot in the village for a period of 48 or more consecutive hours in the same location at any time, except that where more restrictive parking limits have been established the more restrictive limits shall apply. When any law enforcement officer shall find a vehicle standing upon a public street or parking lot in violation of the provisions of this section, he is authorized to move such a vehicle or to require the operator in charge thereof to move such vehicle to a position permitted under this article. The law enforcement officer may cause said vehicle to be removed to a proper impoundment and storage area within the village where storage space is available and in such case the owner shall pay the costs of removing said vehicle and the storage fees on said vehicle before he may recover the

possession thereof (Ord. 2017-4).

10.12.070 Parking near Mailboxes

Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic, or in compliance with law or the direction of a police officer or official traffic control device, or momentarily to pick up or discharge a passenger or passengers, no person shall park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, within fifteen feet of a public or private curbside mailbox between the hours of eight a.m. and five p.m. (Ord. 2017-4).
