13.16.010 Cross-connection defined.

A "cross-connection" shall be defined as any physical connection or arrangement between two otherwise separate systems, one of which contains potable water from the village of Oakfield water system, and the other, water from a private source, water of unknown or questionable safety, or steam, gases or chemicals, whereby there may be a flow from one system to the other, the direction of flow depending on the pressure differential between the two systems. (Ord. dated 11/13/85 § 1)

13.16.020 Cross-connections prohibited—Exception.

No person, firm or corporation shall establish or permit to be established or maintain or permit to be maintained any cross-connection. No interconnection shall be established whereby potable water from a private, auxiliary or emergency water supply other than the regular public water supply of the village of Oakfield may enter the supply or distribution system of said municipality, unless such private, auxiliary or emergency water supply and the method of

connection and use of such supply shall have been approved by the Oakfield municipal water department and by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources in accordance with Section NR 111.25(3), Wisconsin Administrative Code. (Ord. dated 11/13/85 § 2)

13.16.030 Inspections.

It shall be the duty of the Oakfield municipal water department, or its authorized agent, to cause inspections to be made of all properties served by the public water system where cross-connections with the public water system are deemed possible. The frequency of inspections and re-inspections based on potential health hazards involved shall be as established by Oakfield municipal water department and as approved by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. 13.16.040 Water department authorized to request entry and pertinent information.

Upon presentation of credentials, the representative of the Oakfield municipal water department shall have the right to request *entry* at any reasonable time to examine any property served by a connection to the public water system of the village of Oakfield for cross-connections. If entry is refused, such representative shall obtain a special inspection warrant under Section 66.122, Wisconsin Statutes. On request the owner, lessee or occupant of any property so served shall furnish to the inspection agency any pertinent information regarding the piping system or systems on such property. 13.16.050 Discontinuance of service—Notice.

The Oakfield municipal water department is authorized and directed to discontinue water service to any property wherein any connection in violation of this chapter exists, and to take such other precautionary measures deemed necessary to eliminate any danger of contamination of the public water system.

Water service shall be discontinued only after reasonable notice and opportunity for hearing under Chapter 68, Wisconsin Statutes, except as provided in Section 13.16.060. Water service to such property shall not be restored until the cross-connections has been eliminated in compliance with the provisions of this chapter. (Ord. dated 11/13/85 § 5)

13.16.060 Immediate discontinuance when—Opportunity for hearing.

If it is determined by the Oakfield municipal water department that a cross-connection or an emergency endangers public health, safety or welfare and requires immediate action, and a written finding to that effect is filed with the clerk of the village of Oakfield and delivered to the customer's premises, service may be immediately discontinued. The customer shall have an opportunity for hearing under Chapter 68, Wisconsin Statutes, within ten days of such emergency discontinuance. (Ord. dated 11/13/85 § 6)

13.16.070 State Plumbing Code Adopted

The Village of Oakfield adopts by reference the State Plumbing Code of Wisconsin, being Chapter H62, Wisconsin Administrative Code. (Ord. dated 11/13/85 § 7)

13.16.080 Chapter supplements other Regulations.

This chapter does not supersede the State Plumbing Code and Village of Oakfield plumbing ordinance, but is supplementary to them. (Ord. dated 11/13/85 § 8)

**Chapter 13.20
Tax Incremental District Charge**

13.20.010 Imposition.

Tax incremental district charge is hereby imposed upon the village for all sewer and water system costs, including debt service coverage ratio requirements imposed by any bond resolution, which are allocated for improvements undertaken within a tax incremental district of the village. On or before the September village board meeting each year, the village clerk shall compute the charge by calculating an amount equal to the annual debt service on the tax incremental district share of all outstanding water and sewer utility borrowing, including debt service coverage ratio requirements imposed by any bond resolution.

13.20.020 Billing and payment.

The tax incremental district charge shall be billed to the village on October 1st of each year for all obligations due during the subsequent year. The payment shall be due within ninety days of the billing date.
