5.16.010 Junkyard regulations.

No person, partnership, firm or corporation shall hereafter in the village of Oakfield, Wisconsin, conduct or maintain any building, yard or place for the processing, storing or piling of junked automobiles or other machinery or other material or waste products of any kind whatsoever including auto salvage unless such activities be conducted entirely within a building or within an enclosed yard which building or enclosed yard shall be more than three hundred (300) feet distant from any building used for residential purposes. The enclosure referred to shall be a solid painted fence or other structure not less than seven feet in height constructed so that no dust or other material shall pass through said fence or other structure. Said enclosure shall be maintained in a good condition at all times and no articles shall be piled so as to protrude above said enclosure. Such building or enclosure within which such activities are permitted shall be located not less than twentyfive (25) feet from the street or roadline and not less than nine feet from the side lot line. 5.16.020 License application fee.

License application forms may be obtained from the village clerk. The license fee shall be set from time-to-time by resolution of the village board. The village clerk, with the assistance of the police chief, shall verify the information on the application before issuing a license. Licenses shall be issued within 72 hours of the completion of the application, unless denied for sufficient cause of

delayed pending verification of information on the application form. (Ord. 2007-3)

5.16.030 Complaint – Appearance of accused violator before village board.

Upon complaint being made in writing to any village official, that any person, partnership, firm, or corporation has violated the provisions of Section 5.16.010, the village board may summon such accused violator to appear before the village board to respond to such complaint. (Prior code § 11.04[2])

5.16.040 Violation – Penalty.

Any person, partnership or firm or corporation who by himself, or itself, or by his agents or employees, shall violate any provision of this chapter, may, upon being adjudicated to have violated such chapter, be subjected to a forfeiture of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each day that such violation shall continue, together with the cost of prosecution, and in case of default of the payment of such forfeiture and costs, shall be imprisoned in the county jail of Fond du Lac County for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days. In addition to the forfeitures imposed hereunder, the village may have any other legal or equitable remedies under the laws of the state of Wisconsin. (Prior code § 11.04[3])
