

**Chapter 8.20
Flammable Liquids**

Sections:

8.20.010 State regulations adopted—Enforcement.

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The Wisconsin Administrative Code, Chapter Ind. 8 (Flammable Liquids code), issued by the Industrial Commission of Wisconsin, is adopted by reference as a part of this chapter, and it shall be the duty of the building inspector to enforce the provisions thereof. (Priorcode § 7.05).

**Chapter 8.24
Food and Dairy Products**

8.24.010 Grade "A" milk required.

8.24.050 Meat inspection.

8.24.010 Grade "A" milk required.

On and after the twentieth day of February, 1969, no person shall sell, offer or expose for sale any milk or milk product other than Grade "A" milk and milk products as those terms are defined in Wisconsin Administrative Code, Ch. Ag. 80, issued by the State Department of Agriculture and State board of Health, which are incorporated in this section by reference as if fully set forth herein. The clerk is directed to file a certified copy of such regulations in his office for public inspection. (Prior code § 10.03)

8.24.020 Displayed food and dairy products.

The provisions of Section 97.66 of the Wisconsin Statutes relating to covering and display of food and dairy products are adopted by reference and incorporated in this code as if fully set forth herein. (Prior code § 10.06)

8.24.030 Sale of unwholesome or tainted food prohibited.

No person shall sell, offer for sale or hold for sale any meat, fish, fruits, vegetables or other articles of food or drink which is not fresh or properly preserved, sound, wholesome and safe for human consumption or the

flesh of any animal which died by disease. The health officer is authorized and directed to seize and destroy any articles of food or drink which are offered or held for sale to the public which have been become tainted, decayed, spoiled or otherwise unwholesome or unfit for human consumption. 8.24.40 Grocery store and meat market sanitation.

No person shall operate a grocery store or meat market within the village of Oakfield in an unsanitary, filthy or unclean manner so as to endanger the health of patrons or other persons. In all grocery stores and meat markets, refrigerators or refrigerator counters shall be kept in sanitary condition and shall maintain a temperature of forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit or below. Spoiled or unwholesome food shall be removed from the refrigerator immediately upon detection. The walls and ceilings of the store and stockrooms shall be clean and orderly and all refuse or garbage kept inside the premises must be placed in metal containers properly covered and disinfected when necessary. Meat grinders, hooks and all other utensils must be cleaned at the end of each workday. All unwrapped bakery or confectionery products shall be handled in such a manner that they do not come in direct contact with the hands of the individual selling them. The operator of the store or market shall be responsible for compliance with this section.

8.24.050 Meat inspection.

No person shall sell, have, keep or expose for sale for human consumption the flesh or meat food products of any cow, calf, sheep, swine, horse or goat in the village of Oakfield unless the same shall have been slaughtered, inspected or prepared under the supervision of a state of Wisconsin Inspector, or a United States Government Inspector, or

in accordance with the regulations governing the inspection of meat as prescribed by the United States Department of Agriculture Bureau of Animal Industry. The health officer may authorize the sale of meat or meat food products which have been slaughtered, inspected or prepared under the supervision of any municipal inspector or health officer in accordance with prescribed standards which he determines to be substantially similar to the above regulations of the United States Department of Agriculture.
